#### Welcome to the Summer Term!

Dear Parents and Carers.

Welcome back to summer term. I hope everyone had a good break whether celebrating Easter or not.

We are welcoming some lovely new starters, who joined before the break and who visited us the last day, and we are so happy to have them with us.

April is National Pet Month. If your family has a pet, could you share some photos or share information to add to our display board? Some of the children are interested in playing "Pets and Where They Live" Matching Cards.

## STORY

To follow some of the children's interests, we are going to learn the "Dear Zoo" story in the following weeks. The plan is for the children to: listen and act out the story; think about the

different sizes of parcels; their ideas of what could be inside; their feelings of getting an animal; creating their own ending and making a big display. It is a great opportunity for developing language, literacy and maths skills.

## PRESCHOOLERS

Soon parents of preschoolers will know about their allocated school. Please could you share your news with the child's key person or send the information to Annie- our administrator by email.

As a setting, we are preparing the children for this new adventure and working closely on their school readiness. Pre-school Thursday's includes a P.E. session which helps with the preschools physical skills and helps them to practise getting dressed and undressed for P.E. for when they start school. Can we ask that the pre-school children bring in a P.E. kit this term (a pair of shorts/leggings/joggers and a t-shirt) and that they come into playgroup wearing clothes that they find easy to take off and put on independently (no tights or lace up shoes for example). Please ensure these clothes are named and that they are brought in a named bag (please no draw string bags for safety reasons) - these can stay in playgroup for the term.

# SPARE CLOTHES

Please can all the children be sent with plenty of spare clothes, as we will carry on with our indoor and outdoor messy play activities in all weather conditions. Please label every item of clothing, even socks and pants, with your child's name as it helps staff to organise the clothes more efficiently and minimises the risk of misplacing items.

# TOYS FROM HOME

If your child wants to bring a toy in from home to show to their friends, that's fine but please ensure you have taken the toy before you leave. This will help us avoid having lost or broken toys, which can be very stressful for the young child. Comforters are an exception as they play a crucial role in supporting children's emotional security during unsettling times.

# FUNDRAISING

We plan to hold a craft market at the beginning of May (see Dates for your Diary). Our last fundraising event (Easter Egg Hunt) covered the cost of the grass that needed replacement

in the garden. We organise fundraising every other month to cover new equipment or staff training.
